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About Us

At Cavalla International University of America and Liberia, you are part of an international community of students and highly distinguished professors. The University welcomes all our students from around the world. Our online community of faculty and students bring together creative, passionate, and intellectually engaged students from all around the globe, with the common goal of obtaining excellent, innovative, and creative education along with a high standard of research skills. Cavalla International University of America is an American online university or an American Accelerated University as it is commonly called. The university uses internet and electronics methods to conduct live classes for its students. Students are also encouraged to study independently with the help of an assigned faculty mentor.

Cavalla International University of America and Liberia offers over 100 degrees and over 20 specialized certification courses from the graduate school, Barclay College of Law and the 5 undergraduate colleges. The university offers doctoral degrees, Law degrees and undergraduate degrees, including Arts and Sciences, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health and Sciences, Business Administration and Management and many Specialized Certification Courses that will meet the interest and needs of our global students. The university endeavors to hire and recruit highly qualified and reputable local and international professors to guide the students as faculty members and mentors. The programs are flexible and affordable and take into consideration the busy schedule of students that are working adults. Our global community is open and welcomes all to be part of the wonderful learning experience at Cavalla International University. Professors at Cavalla International University are those who have received a canonical mission to teach in the name of the Church, educating disciples in lessons of faith and morality. This devotion to theological scholarship is augmented by access to major, international conferences that expose students to presentations, lectures, and thought leadership from world-renowned scholars and speakers.

Christianity came to Liberia with the first settlers from the United States, and the majority of Liberians still identify as Christian today: Baptist Church was organized in 1820 on the ship Elizabeth that brought the first settlers to Liberia. Methodist Church was established in 1822 by Black immigrants from the Americas who sought to Christianize and educate the indigenous Africans. Presbyterian Church was established in 1833, and the first Presbyterian missionary arrived in 1834. Episcopal Church in 1921, the American church appointed its first Suffragan Bishop, T. Momolu Gardiner. Catholic Church in 2020, there were approximately 348,000 Catholics in Liberia, which is 7.52% of the population. Christianity came to Liberia along with the first settlers from the United States. Protestants and Roman Catholics settled in Liberia during the 19th century and spread Christianity throughout much of the region. Today, the overwhelming majority of Liberians still identify as Christians.

In the Heart of Religion

"Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth" (John Paul II, *Fides et ratio*). At the School of Theology and Religious Studies, we are committed to contemplating the truth by God's gifts of faith and reason, and we strive to do so in the communion of the Religious, nourished by the Eucharist, the source and summit of the religious life. No truth is alien to us: while most of us work in the theological sciences, others work in the realm of religious studies, bringing to bear the best of the social sciences and historical research in pursuit of greater understanding of religion, especially in its complex intersection with human culture.

As the nation's premier Cavalla International University, The Cavalla International University of America and Liberia has long played a leadership role in larger conversations: conversations within the Religious about matters of intense social and theological importance; conversations between the Religious and other Christian communities in the United States and beyond; and conversations between the Religious and American society. It has played this leadership role first and foremost by the theological education provided by the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies to its students, great numbers of whom have gone on to play leadership roles at every level of society, in the United States, Liberia, and throughout the world, and by the research, publications, and public contributions of its faculty.

History

From its foundation the Cavalla International University of America and Liberia has given academic priority to theology and religious studies and related disciplines. Initially, the academic programs in these areas were offered in the School of Sacred Sciences (1889). In time there emerged the School of Canon Law (1923), followed by a Seminary Program (1931) and, within the School of Arts and Sciences, the Program of Religion (1932). The original School of Sacred Sciences was later divided into a School of Sacred Theology and a School of Philosophy (1937). In 1970 a Liturgical Studies Program was instituted.

After an extensive review of programs and structures, the Board of Trustees approved the newly establish Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies in November 2024. The Department is composed of five departments: Biblical Studies, Canon Law, Church History, Religion and Religious Education, and Theology. In 2024, the Board of Trustees voted that Canon Law be reestablished and that the remaining academic units of the Department become programs in the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies. By thus, coordinating existing units, The Cavalla International University of America and Liberia established a Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies as a national center of academic research, instruction, and service. Students also have a set of general education requirements, which is more deliberately tailored to support their major than was possible in the past.

Accreditation

Cavalla International University has not sought accreditation with any US based accrediting bodies.

CORE VALUES

Cavalla International University is an American International and Liberian University. Currently, the university offers all its programs online. The faculty at Cavalla International University (CIU) endeavors to provide excellent, affordable, and flexible educational programs to all its students. Cavalla International University was established in 1990 as a correspondence school, specializing in providing high quality professional education to working adults who wanted to pursue a specific area of expertise in Accounting, Business, Finance, Human Resource, Computer training and Marketing. The school continues to provide professional education on a course-by-course basis until 1998 when the board and faculty approved the college to be a full-fledged degree granting institution. The Doctor of Juris (J.D.) and the undergraduate degrees were subsequently initiated in the same year and the college was reclassified as a university.

The primary goal of the university since then has been to provide excellent professional education to busy working adults who may not be able to attend traditional university due to family commitment, job commitment, high cost of attending college/university and other demands of society that may prevent career minded people from pursuing their academic goals. In 2005 the university was approved to begin granting master's degrees and three years later in 2008 the Board of Trustees approved the university to grant Doctor of Philosophy Degrees. The university does not have residency requirements for students. As an international university, CIU endeavors to recruit qualified and reputable professors from the international community. The university offers professional and academic degrees. Cavalla International University has excellent world class educational programs. The programs are inexpensive in comparison to American Universities with similar programs, it has flexible programs to meet the needs of busy working adults and mothers. The online nature of the University affords students the chance to learn both theory and practice of their specific area of study.

The University has an open enrollment policy. Students can apply anytime during a semester. However, applications received after a semester have begun will be processed and evaluated for the next semester. Students can choose to enroll in one of our accelerated programs. The standard semester is 12 weeks, and the University has two accelerated programs: 6 weeks and 8 weeks. Cavalla International University has excellent world class educational programs. The programs are inexpensive in comparison to American Universities with similar programs, it has flexible programs to meet the needs of busy working adults and mothers. The online nature of the University affords students the chance to learn both theory and practice of their specific area of study.

	The IRB is charged with the responsibility of reviewing, prior to its initiation, all research (whether funded or not) involving human participants. The IRB is concerned with protecting the welfare, rights, and privacy of human subjects. The IRB has the authority to approve, exempt, disapprove, monitor, and require modifications in all research activities that fall within its jurisdiction as specified by both the federal regulations and institutional policy.	
	The IRB shall have at least five members of varying backgrounds in order to provide complete and adequate review of human research and its institutional, legal, scientific, and social implications. The Board will also include at least one member who is not affiliated with the institution and one member who is not a scientist. The IRB	

has several consultants who advise the Board and are periodically involved in protocol review.
